


OVERVIEW

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Thunder Bay IDN is comprised of one Local Health Hub – Thunder Bay.


POPULATION:

- The City of Thunder Bay IDN is the most populated district in the North West LHIN, with a total population of 127,975
- The City of Thunder Bay IDN accounts for 55.3% of the North West LHIN's total population
- · The median age of the population in Thunder Bay is 44
- The City of Thunder Bay IDN has the second highest proportion of adults over the age of sixty-five (65) accounting for 17.2% of the total population
- The City of Thunder Bay IDN has an approximate total area of 37,100 square kilometers

HEALTH SYSTEM:

- The City of Thunder Bay IDN has 26 unique health service providers offering 41 LHIN-funded programs
